From Pastor Kent's Desk

We're heading out to New Mexico again this year to spend some time at Ghost Ranch, in Abiquiu. Abiquiu was for many years the home of American artist, Georgia O'Keefe. Go to any major art museum in the US, and you'll find at least one O'Keefe hanging in the 20th century American wing. She spent many summers on the Ranch itself in the 1930's through the 1960's, painting the spectacular scenery which defines the Ranch.

The Ranch was given to the Presbyterian Church in the 1950's and it has been used as a retreat center and movie location ever since. I spent the summer of 1967 at the Ranch between my junior and senior years of college working on the College Staff. Our advisor that summer was the Rev. John Conner, Campus Pastor at the University of Oregon. John went on to be the Moderator of the General Assembly of the UPCUSA in 1975. The summer of 1967 was the infamous "Summer of Love," right at the height of the Hippie Movement. I won't go into the details – suffice-it-to-say it was quite an experience for me! Life-changing, actually! It solidified my decision to work in the church.

Ghost Ranch is what is referred to as a "thin place;" a place where the divine is present in extraordinary ways. The immensity, the beauty, the silence, the scenery, all coalesce to create an environment in which the "sacred" is present. One is literally put in touch with God. It's virtually impossible not to be transported to a higher plane when you're there. Over the years, I've visited the Ranch on countless occasions – I never tire of being there.

One doesn't have to go all the way to the Southwest to find "thin places." For example, Tucquan Glen is a mini "thin place," especially in the spring when the foliage is green and the water seeps out of the rocks. Or, Longwood Gardens, in any season, can serve as one, too.

God is available to us in many guises. All that's required of us is to look carefully, with wonder and eyes wide-open. God loves being in relationship with us! God is besotted with us and meets us in all sorts of places. God waits patiently for us to take notice, and when we do, God is thrilled! This summer take time to find your own "thin places," those places where *your* soul soars and your heart races. Believe me, you'll be richly blessed when you do!
